

Continuing our commitment to highlight the work of exceptional DC-based emerging artists, Transformer's 15th Annual DC Artist Solo Exhibition presents the work of Adrienne Gaither in her first solo exhibition.

How I Got Over presents a new body of paintings and collage works recounting Gaither's personal recovery from traumatic events in her life. Gaither expresses the impact of trauma and visualizes what it means to become "whole" again while addressing the parallels between recovery and painting as time based processes.

Expanding upon her hard edge geometric abstract painting style, the shapes and color choices recall specific emotions and establish a consistent visual language throughout the series. These lively, varied, and imaginative works with undertones of violence and trauma are Gaither's attempt to affirm her trauma and recovery process as valid and deserving of space and recognition as a survivor.

Gaither explains, "Though trauma recovery is a constant "work in progress", the possibility of reformation exists despite the negativity, powerlessness, and isolation associated with trauma. Through this work, I intend to amplify the resilience and bravery of survivors while creating a space that normalizes the conversation around trauma, recovery and the space it occupies in our human existence".

Adrienne Gaither (b.1987) is a visual artist whose work explores color and shape to recompose various ways of communicating an idea. Her works can be conceptual and narrative, serious and playful, and are distinctly constructed with influences of West African Patternmaking, Suprematism, Constructivism, Minimalism, the Bauhaus, and Abstraction.

She has exhibited at Strathmore in Bethesda, MD, The National African American Museum and Cultural Museum, Wilberforce, OH, PRIZM Art Fair at Miami Art Basel, and MoCADA (Museum of Contemporary African Diasporan Arts) in Brooklyn, NY. Gaither lives and works in Washington, DC.
