Transformer is pleased to present *Bloodlines*, a group exhibition curated by Martina Dodd, which seeks to challenge the societal norms and restraints imposed on the female form by exploring the external and internal pressures and pleasures of the body. Drawing from their own personal and collective experiences Lisa Hill, Samera Paz, Iman Person, Tsedaye Makonnen and members of the ajé collective examine the corporeal connectivity to their own body and ancestral histories through works on paper, sculpture and performance.

Martina Dodd is a DC based art historian and curator. Her concept driven shows have touched on topics relating to race, gender and power dynamics. She is intrigued by the ways in which value is placed on art and seeks to examine the social impact material culture has on society.
