Transformer is proud to present the 9th year of the *Exercises for Emerging Artists* program with *E9: Design — Mass Fad Discharge*, a group exhibition featuring works by emerging graphic designers: Christie Liberatore, Shawn Moriarty, and Noelle Weber.

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Launched in March 2004, Transformer's *Exercises For Emerging Artists* program was created to support artists at a critical points or crossroads in their professional growth and development, and to advance participating artists' creative careers. This program is designed to stimulate and encourage participating artists as they create new work.

Beginning in March 2012, the participating artists met bi-weekly for two hour peer critiques of newly developing bodies of work led by guest facilitator Maria Habib, Senior Director of Design at the Corcoran Gallery of Art, and Natalie Cheung, artist and Exhibitions Manager at Transformer. In tandem with these facilitated peer critiques, the participating artists received mentorship and critical feedback on their work from visiting mentors: Drew Mitchell, President of Fathom Creative, Sarah Tanguy, Curator for ART in Embassies US Department of State, and Matthew Stevenson, Senior Art Director of Fathom Creative.

Maria Habib, facilitator for *E9: Design* states: "During the daily grind, designers are often tasked with clearly and critically relaying a message on behalf of a client. So what to do when this 'message' may be silly, far-fetched or if it actually isn't conveying anything at all? You bullshit. These three talented designers of *E9: Design* took this opportunity to exercise what they do best: give meaning to the meaningless, highlight the absurd, and have fun along the way. They explored themes of visual language fads and over-consumption and resulting constipation. All framed with a golden shimmer for the viewer to bedazzled!"
