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Washington, DC: Transformer is pleased to present *PRISMMMs*, the 2nd exhibition within the two-part *Double Rainbow: Future Archives* by artists Holly Bass and Maps Glover, presented in collaboration with CulturalDC. *PRISMMMs* at Transformer features highlights from Bass and Glover's expansive performance video archives in a light-filled installation echoing hues from the SMPTE color bar.

Recognizing that creating public archives of their experiences as Black artists preserves their importance in history, with *PRISMMMs* Holly Bass & Maps Glover share videos of Bass's performances from the mid-1990s to the early 2000s, and Glover's performances from 2015-2020. *PRISMMMs* is informed by the Black experience, particularly how video documentation has been used to legitimize and validate Black life in a society that seeks to erase Black people's humanity.

"By collaborating to create an exhibition of video work that showcases our live performance work, and inviting our parents and cousins and aunts and uncles into the art space with us, we prioritize audiences that have been historically excluded from predominantly white art spaces. When we share our work on social media and invite our friends, collaborators, and other District residents into the gallery to see our work, we create opportunities for discussion and reflection on the beautiful complexity and diversity that exists within the Black community of Washington, DC. We shift the narrative. We represent ourselves, our cultural lineages, and our collective futures. *Double Rainbow* refers to a rare meteorological phenomenon in which two full rainbows can be seen simultaneously, with one arcing directly above the other." – Holly Bass & Maps Glover

PRISMMMs is a physical representation showing that Black conceptual artists are part of the larger Black community: representing themselves, celebrating cultural lineages, and championing collective futures. As an alternative to the traditional rainbow, the SMPTE color bars are symbolic of analog video and represent the changes in video technology, memory, and visual culture. These color bars are used to create an immersive experience into the past and future of Bass and Glover's work.

This presentation of archival work shifts the narrative and amplifies the importance of visual representation, and is an explicit invitation to DC's Black community, welcoming and prioritizing this audience, which continues to be excluded by the art world.

ABOUT THE ARTISTS:

Holly Bass is a multidisciplinary performance and visual artist, writer and director. Her work has been presented at spaces such as the Kennedy Center, the Smithsonian National Portrait Gallery, the Seattle Art Museum, and the 2022 Venice Biennale. Her visual art work includes photography, installation, video and performance. A gifted and dedicated teaching artist, she directed a year-round creative writing and performance program for the DC juvenile detention center for four years and continues to facilitate workshops nationally and internationally.

Maps Glover is a multidisciplinary performance and visual artist, with a focus on Afrofuturism. His works have been performed all around the country in spaces such as the Kennedy Center, the National Portrait Gallery, Albright University, and the Centre Pompidou in Paris, France. His visual art work includes photography, installation, video, performance, and his murals and can be found in publications such as the Washington Post, the Washington Informer's Bridge, Hello Mr., and Relapse magazine.
